The STaC being held the first week of May is a "Royal STaC," meaning that the masterpoints will be <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> each black, red, silver, and gold. This includes the monthly Individual game.


Now for the final (for now) installment of "Doesn't This Game Drive You Bonkers?" For a change, Yours Truly was the beneficiary of the Bridge Gods' humor (maybe "sadism" would fit better), instead of the victim. With both vulnerable, RHO deals and opens 2NT. You, East, find yourself holding:

and are treated to this auction:

South	West	North	East
pass	pass	2NT	pass
3♣	pass	3♠	pass
4♠	all pas	S	-

Okay, what to lead? Before looking at the entire deal, decide what *you* would lead. Nothing really stands out (to me!), but a lead of either major is unappealing. (Make that "suicidal.") Let's try the  $\blacklozenge$ 9, second best from a poor suit. Ready for some fun? The full deal:



North, a confirmed optimist, evidently liked his concentrated honors and did not discount the  $\forall$ J9. But the punishment surely did not fit the crime, if crime it was. West ruffed the opening lead, and played the  $\forall$ A followed by the  $\forall$ 5 as I "encouraged" with the  $\forall$ 3. Another diamond, the  $\bigstar$ A, and a second club, taken in dummy. Now a trump to the Queen, losing to the stiff King, and yet *another* diamond ruff! At this point, the defense had shot its wad, but that was *seven* tricks lost, down a cruel *four*, 400 to E-W. Believe it or not, this was not a top board for East-West! One lucky E-W pair played  $1 \forall X$  (don't ask *me*!), making three despite holding only 16 HCP between them, +560. Go figure! But the look on poor North's face at my table was priceless to behold.
